Sub:- Election Department – Revision of Electoral Roll – Deletion of names of Dead voters –reg.

Ref:- Lr. No.22/2/2004/PLN-11 dated 5.10.2005 from the Election Commission of India, New Delhi.

The Election Commission of India in their letter referred above (copy enclosed) instructed that standing instructions deletion of names of dead voters, has issued in their order No. 22/2/1994 dated 28.03.1994 for compliance. The said order states that

- (i) Every Municipality and every other local body located in any and every constituency in the state through its Registrar of Births & Deaths shall mandatorily furnish the details to the Electoral Registration Officer of the Constituency in which the dead person was resident as per the address given in the register of deaths, the names together with age at the time of death and the address of the dead persons on the 1<sup>st</sup> January and the 1<sup>st</sup> July every calendar year.
- (ii) The information, in writing, shall each the concerned Electoral Registration Officer (Thasildar) not later than 15<sup>th</sup> January and 15<sup>th</sup> July of every calendar year.

The Commission has taken a serious view of the non-compliance of its standing instructions in this regard and has therefore desired that these be reiterated for strict compliance in future.

Directions in this regard may be given to the concerned officers of Corporations, Municipalities & Panchayats. Receipt of the letter may be acknowledged.
